Treasurer and District Grand Organist for several years and called the Brethren to stand to order whilst the D.G. Organist played the Dead March in "Saul" as a mark of their respect and sorrow.

Wor. Bro. F. H. English acting for the President of the Board of General Purposes presented the report of the Board which was ordered to be placed on the Minutes (Appendix B).

The Deputy District Grand Master by virtue of the authority granted by the Most Wor. The Grand Master to commemorate the Masonic Peace Celebration appointed and invested Wor. Bro. F. H. English, P.D.G.S. Deacon, and Wor. Bro. H. Carpmael, P.D.G.

Treasurer, D.G. Secretary, as Past District Grand Wardens and presented them with their Diplomas.

The Deputy District Grand Master addressed the District Grand Lodge and expressed his pleasure at seeing so many present, and also thanked the Wor. Master and Members of Lodge Negri Sembilan under whose banner they were met for the kind welcome they had given and for the excellent arrangements made for holding the meeting. He also took the opportunity of presenting a message from the District Grand Master expressing his hope that District Grand Lodge would make arrangements institute a permanent memorial to those who had fallen during the war, for which object a meeting would be held the following day to consider what was the best way to carry out this wish. The Deputy District Grand Master congratulated the Lodges in the District on the large number of their members who had responded to their countries' call in its time of need and paid a tribute to the memory of those brethren who had made the supreme sacrifice.

Under the heading of "General," a letter was read from the Grand Secretary with regard to the great care which should be taken in the formation of new Lodges.

Letters of apology from absent members and a letter of regret from the District Grand Master of the Middle East who was unavoidably prevented from attending.

A service of thanksgiving and commemoration service for the restoral of Peace was then held by the District Grand Chaplain who gave an inspiring address. (Appendix C).

District Grand Lodge was closed in due form at 8-20 p.m.

DEAR SIR AND RT. WOR. BROTHER,

I have the honour to present the report of the District Grand Board of General Purposes for the first half of the year, May to November, 1919.

Regular meetings of the Board were held in May, August and November and a special meeting was held on 7th October.

The special meeting was called for the purpose of suggesting a permanent memorial to perpetuate the memory of the members of the Craft in this district who had fallen in the war.

It was proposed that the best way would be to re-construct the Temple of the Lodge in Singapore.

It was decided that all the Lodges in the District should be informed of this proposition and that each Lodge be asked to send two representatives to a business meeting of D.G. Lodge to discuss the question.

At the November meeting, correspondence was read from a Lodge in the District enquiring whether dues should be paid on behalf of Brethren who had left the Colony on Active Service and returned.

It was decided that dues should be paid in respect of all Brethren who had been demobilized or who had been returned to the Colony under civil life condition.
